Minoo Emami

Bio & CV

Minoo Emami is an Iranian multidisciplinary artist with over three decades of experience in art practice, teaching, and exhibition. A first-generation college student, she transitioned from self-taught painter to formal art studies in the U.S. from 2015 to 2021. Her work explores Middle Eastern patriarchy through the lens of transnational justice and equity. Her projects integrate various mediums, from digital to traditional crafts.

Since 1997, Minoo's anti-war series, *Peace March* has examined the long-term effects of war – destruction, trauma, and damaged identity. This series draws from personal experience and interviews with Iranian and Iraqi women, using prostheses as symbols of resilience to highlight the war's impact on families.

Her recent project, *Andaruni Landscapes*, focuses on the Persian domestic space and examines gender roles in traditional culture. Minoo reimagines "Andaruni" as an anthropological space historically reserved for women, offering security and privacy in a male-dominated society. Self-performance videos projected within her artwork capture women's psychological experiences, revealing the public-private dynamic and the interplay between women's bodies and domestic spaces. Her art confronts colonial stereotypes, reframing Iran's post-revolutionary history through a feminist lens.

Currently, Minoo focuses on the female intergenerational learning role, domestic workers, and the liberating power of the internet and social media in driving political and community progress. She examines how these digital tools foster dialogue, amplify marginalized voices, and create new avenues for social activism across borders.

Minoo has given talks and presentations at universities and institutions in the U.S. and taught at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill and RISD CE. She won the 2022 Alumni Traveling Fellowship at SMFA at Tufts University and the 2019 UNC Alumni Sculpture Garden Grant. Her work has been written about and exhibited in solo, and group shows nationally and internationally. Her work has been collected privately and within the permanent collection of the Newport Art Museum, Newport, Rhode Island, USA, and at Lettre International in Berlin, Germany.
